

Club Sailing Day Risk Assessment

Hazard	Level of Risk	How will risk be managed
Injury from sailing equipment eg boom	Med	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Experience of those taking boats out. OOD can advise on this. • First aid kit available in hut
Boat unable to return to Mill Point eg strength of tide or lack of wind	High	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check out and in system for club craft used. • Rescue boat available at the point with two people on board if possible
Capsize situation	High	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Experience of those taking boats out. OOD can advise on this. • Check out and in system for club craft used. • Rescue boat available at the point
Collision with other boat on the water	Low	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Experience of those taking boats out. OOD can advise on this. • For those unfamiliar with river point out issue of River Link boat
Drowning	Med	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All users of club boats to wear buoyancy aids.
Child drowning whilst swimming or playing in the water at the point	Med	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parents to be responsible to for own children. • Wearing of buoyancy aids even if only paddling/swimming
Slip or trip injury	High	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First aid kit available in hut
Injury from falling from chain above quarry	High	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only to be used for purpose intended. (no children to play on this at any time) • Children to use only with adult supervision

Emergency Action Plan

- Alert officer of the day to any potential situation. The OOD should be visible and on the shore at all times
- Establish a first aider/medically trained person to attend to casualty and send for help if necessary
